Whoever continues to say this did not witness the match between CSI and CCC in round 2 of the LIICL playoffs of the 2007-8 season. Early on in the match, CCC's Rich Viale, playing board 3, came to captain Paul Montenero and asked, "should I offer Clay Wilke a draw?" Thinking of the team, Rich pointed out that CSI held tie-break odds and CCC would need to win at least one board to advance to the semi-finals. The game was very even, and Rich said, "maybe I'll play on a little longer and see what happens." Paul agreed that this was a good "team" strategy.

The first game to end was on board 4 where Dennis Hom shocked the lower rated Paul Montenero by playing an R for N sacrifice to force a draw! Dennis had faith that his teammates would at least draw the match. On board 1, Terry Lamb, of CCC, who also had a drawn position early on, pressed his game forward looking for that necessary win. It was an odd sight to see Terry's opponent, George Berg, one of the best time-pressure players

this writer has ever seen, with a significant time advantage. If I remember correctly, George had 23 minutes to Terry's 10 at one point. With the match tied at 1/2 - 1/2, the other three games all went down to the point where each player had less than five minutes remaining on their clocks.

The second game to finish was back on board 3, where Rich Viale's position deteriorated into a clearly losing position. But with 9 seconds left on Clay Wilke's clock, he touched one piece then removed his hand, intending to move another. Rich pointed this out to him and Clay's clock expired as he struggled to find a good move for that piece he had originally touched. That was the victory that CCC needed to have a chance at winning the match.

Board 1 would finish next. The position was so wild that it was above this writer's chess expertise to say whether the position was still drawn or if George Berg had the upper hand over Terry Lamb. George started trading off pieces and the game did indeed end in a draw. So the match would be decided on Board 2, where the crowd quietly muttered that CCC's Mike Dorsky was suffering a cramped, inferior position against CSI's Jim Dwulit. Both opponents seemed to have about one minute left on their analog clock when a flurry of trades began. In the midst of this, a mistake, even worse than that made by Clay Wilke earlier, was committed by Dorsky as he touch one piece but then moved another. Dwulit called him on it saying, "you've got to move the other piece." However, Dwulit never bothered to claim the time penalty he was entitled to, which would have added two minutes to his clock. That might have given him a thinking advantage and victory. The flurry of exchanges continued until a single black knight remained on the board with the kings, and the game, of course, was drawn by insufficient mating material. CCC thus claimed victory 2-1/2 to 1-1/2 and moved on to play LSF in the semi-finals.

By thinking of their teams, many of the players involved play unusual sacrifices, pressed drawn positions into near losses, and battled time pressure. But it all came down to Rich Viale's original decision to play on instead of offering a draw. His win was the difference. This was clearly the most exciting chess match this writer has ever witnessed or been involved in!

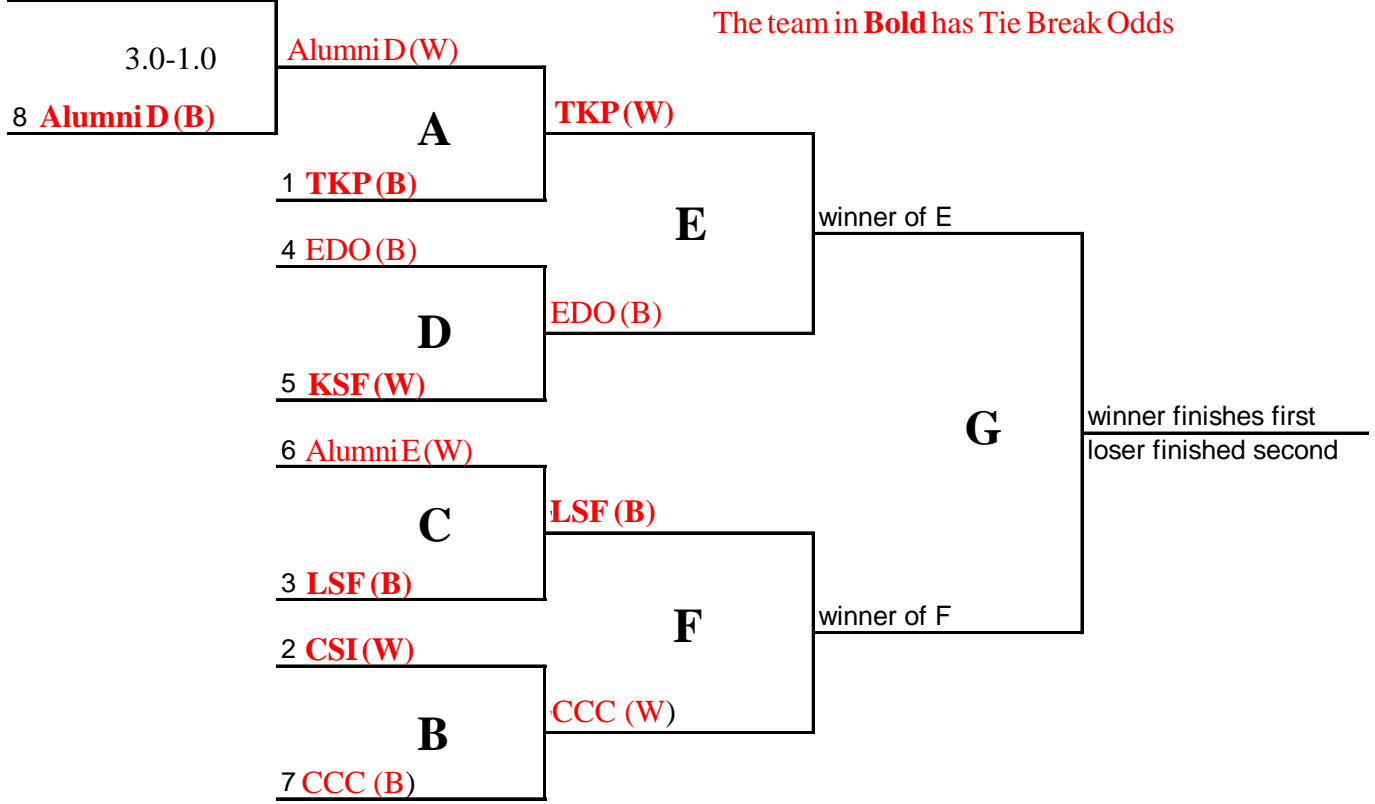

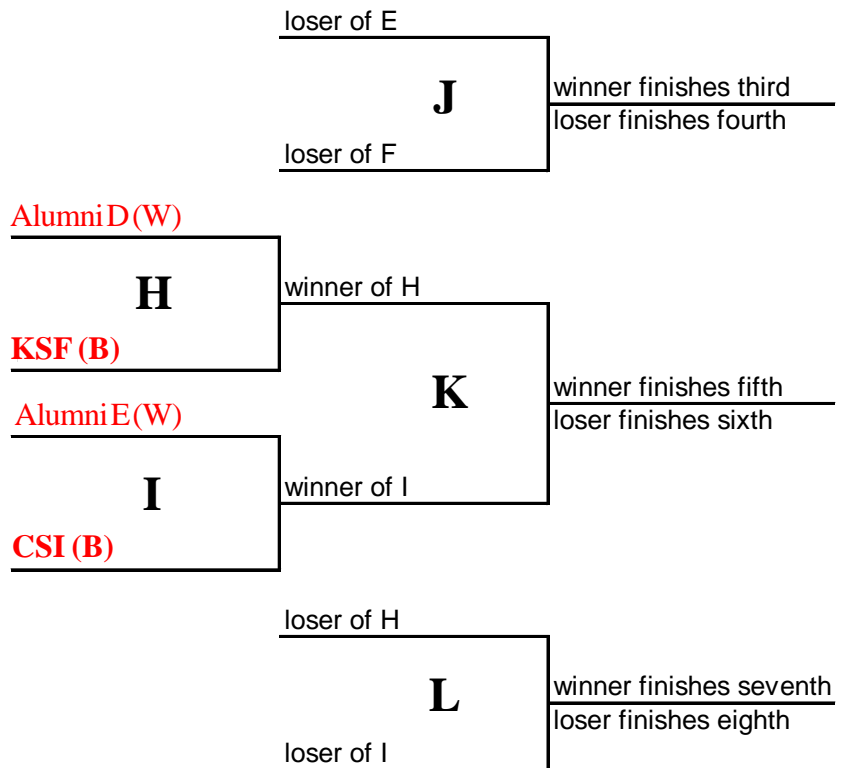

Complete Bracketology

As the brackets on this page shows, each match to be played has been assigned a letter. In round 1, match "P" will pit the eighth and ninth place finishers in the play-in contest to enter the quarterfinals. The winner advances to match "A" and the loser is now free to enter all members in the Individual Tournament which is held concurrently with the playoff rounds. In round 2 the four quarterfinal ("A", "B", "C" and "D") matches will be held. The four winners advance to the semis in matches "E" and "F". The four losing teams will play in the bottom brackets shown as matches "H" and "I". In the semifinals, round 3, the winners of "E" and "F" will advance to match "G", for the Championship. The losers will then play each other in match "J" for third place overall. The winners of matches "H" and "I" will face each other in match "K" on finals night (round 4) with the winner taking fifth place. The losers of matches "H" and "I" will play in match "L" for seventh place. As always, those players who are alternates for their teams and are not participating in the team matches, may sign up for the Individual Swiss Tournament. All games in match play will double as Individual contest games. April 25th is Round 5 of the Individual Swiss and all players who show will be paired per Swiss tournament rules.
